你上几年级? 🖤	Which grade do you attend?
我上六年级, 你呢? 🕥	I attend sixth grade, how about you?

Language Points

1. 上+学校/年级 (to attend+schools/grades)

- 不 / 也+verbs
 The usage of 不 and 也 isn't the same as in English.
 我不上大华初中。(Literal English: I no attend DAHUA middle school.)
- 3. Question Word 几 (how many) 几:几岁 (how old),几月几日(when),星期几(what day of the week)
- 你上哪个学校?
 Use a location to replace 哪个 when you answer the question.


Activity Pictures in Mandarin Classroom
